#### 2. (a) Housing & Other Disposal – Tithíocht & Díuscairt Eile

(i) It was proposed by CIIr. John Brennan seconded by CIIr. Tomás Breathnach and agreed:

"That, in accordance with the provisions of Section 183 of the Local Government Act, 2001, Kilkenny County Council hereby approves of the disposal of its interest in dwelling at Kiltown, Castlecomer, Co. Kilkenny (as identified on the attached map) to Ellen Byrne and Elizabeth (Betty) Byrne, Kiltown, Castlecomer, Co. Kilkenny for the nominal sum of  $\leq 10$  (ten euro) with Kilkenny County Council being responsible for all legal costs associated with the transfer. Area measures 0.4071 ha." (Notice sent to Members on the 2<sup>nd</sup> January, 2020).

(ii) It was proposed by Cllr. Andrew McGuinness seconded by Cllr. Michael Doyle and agreed:

"That, in accordance with the provisions of Section 183 of the Local Government Act, 2001, Kilkenny County Council hereby approves of the disposal of its interest in a plot of land at 64 Ossory Park, Kilkenny to Patricia Dullard, daughter of Ellen Jeffrey (deceased)." # (b) Planning

#### (i) Part 8: Vicar Street

Mr. Ian Gardner, Senior Engineer presented a PowerPoint presentation on the proposed Improvement Scheme for Vicar Street, Kilkenny. In his presentation, he gave an overview on the following:

- Location and current access to Vicar Street.
- Current status of traffic movements, road and footpath conditions, number of traffic movements.
- Existing issues that prevail for traffic users and pedestrians.
- Rationale for Scheme.
- Details of average daily traffic on Vicar Street and at various junctions heading to Vicar Street.
- Proposed recommendations.

He advised that the proposed Scheme for Vicar Street is one way going South and the introduction of cycle lane. This will go forward for Part 8 Planning shortly. The public will have an opportunity to make submissions.

It was proposed by CIIr. Martin Brett, seconded by CIIr. John Coonan and agreed that Kilkenny County Council proceed with Part 8 Planning for this Road Improvement Scheme. It was agreed to circulate the presentation to all Members for their information.

#### (ii) Part 8: Housing at Ladywell, Thomastown

Mr. Paddy Crotty, Senior Executive Engineer gave a presentation on the proposed development of 25 units at Ladywell, Thomastown. In his presentation he gave an overview on the following:

- Demand for Housing in Thomastown and requirement for 1 bed, 2 bed, 3 bed and 4 bed units.
- Timeframe for Part 8 Process.
- Site location and access to the site.
- Proposed house designs broken down per unit type.
- Overview of site plan and house type layout.
- Proposal for road widening on Ladyswell Road.

Mr. Crotty advised that there is ongoing discussions with the adjoining landowner and Grennan College in relation to land acquisition and access to the school's playing pitches.

CIIr. Deirdre Cullen welcomed the proposed plan for the development of 25 units in Thomastown and the number of units which will be wheelchair accessible.

It was proposed by CIIr. Deirdre Cullen, seconded by CIIr. Denis Hynes that Kilkenny County Council proceed with Part 8 Planning for this development.

#### (c) (i) Public Lighting Retrofit

Mr. Ken Boland, Senior Executive Engineer gave a PowerPoint Presentation on the Local Authority Public Lighting Energy Efficiency Project.

In his presentation he gave an overview on the following:

- Works carried out to-date in Kilkenny on approx. 5,000 lights
- 5,359 further lights to be upgraded.
- Cost of works, grant funding and annual savings to Kilkenny County Council.
- Photos of before and after of lights retrofitted to-date.
- Kilkenny is lead authority for Region 2 East for 10 counties.
- Rationale for the National Project.
- Outcomes of the National Project.
- Benefits of the National Project.
- Project timelines.
- Financing of the Project for the Country.

CIIr. Peter Cleere complimented the work already done to-date and the improvements made on the lights already retrofitted.

#### (d) (i) Festival Grants 2020

Mr. Sean McKeown presented his report on the allocation of Festival Grants for 2020. He advised Members that the report circulated should have read 14 grant applications and 14 grants awarded. A budget provision €112,000 was approved by the Members. 80% of the budget i.e. €89,000 is allocated to Festivals that have an impact on tourism. The Council will encourage the Festival Committees to "green" their festivals and become local champions of our Climate Change policies and commitments. Mr. McKeown recommended that 14 Festival Grants be approved as set out in the schedule attached to the report.

Cathaoirelach acknowledged the increase in the budget and the significant contribution by Kilkenny County Council to supporting these annual festivals.

It was proposed by CIIr. Martin Brett, seconded by CIIr. Tomás Breathnach and agreed:

"That the Festival & Event Grants 2019 totalling  $\in$  89,000 are hereby approved by the Members of Kilkenny Councy Council, as per report circulated."

#### (e) (i) Chief Executive's Monthly Report

Ms. Colette Byrne, Chief Executive presented her Monthly Chief Executive Report.

Cathaoirleach CIIr. Peter Cleere advised Members that any queries arising from the report should be taken up with the Chief Executive. The report was being taken as read.

#### 01 (20) Laois County Council

"That this Council calls on the Minister for Communications, Climate Action & Environment, Mr. Richard Bruton, T.D. to stop the rollout of 5G Fifth Generation Cellular Technology across the Country – we as a Council and public representatives have a moral and ethical responsibility to protect the health and wellbeing of our citizens – there is a reason why insurance companies will not insure 5G – this needs to be investigated further by an independent company with no prospect of financial gain."

#### 02 (20) Waterford City & County Council

"That Waterford City and County Council in keeping with the objective of making Waterford a fair employment area agrees with and endorses the right of all employees to be represented individually and/or collectively by a trade union if they so wish. We would expect and encourage all employers and their representative organisations in Waterford City/County to fully recognise this basic fundamental human right and so not intimidate, harass or threaten the continued employment of those exercising this right."

#### 03 (20) Monaghan County Council

"Monaghan County Council calls on the Minister for Communications, Climate Action and the Environment, Richard Bruton TD and Minister for Finance, Paschal Donohoe TD:

Legislate for a deposit return scheme to be introduced on recyclable packaging. Ensure that all local authorities in the state be funded to provide a climate action officer to incorporate energy efficiency in all aspects of Council work. Introduce a carbon tax on aviation fuel."
