Dear Councillor,

A provision of £112,000 has been included in the Council's adopted Budget for 2021 for the Festivals and Events Grant Scheme. In line with adopted Council policy - 80% of the Budget was allocated to the *Tourism Festival Grant Scheme (managed and administered by the Tourism Section)*. At the March meeting of Kilkenny County Council the festivals recommended for approval under the Tourism Festival Grant Scheme 2021 were approved by elected members.

A total of 8 Festival Grants were awarded in line with the Budget provision made for 2021. Of those 8 festivals 3 have now confirmed that they will not proceed in 2021 due to Covid 19 restrictions. These include the Savour Festival, Iverk Show and Tradfest. An amount of €21,500 was allocated to these festivals and will not be required by them in 2021. It is anticipated that all three festivals will return during 2022 and we look forward to their continued contribution to Kilkennys communities, profile and economy in the future.

During 2021 the number of festivals progressing with live shows and events is limited. The Kilkenny Arts Festival has confirmed its programme for 2021 with a commitment to a mix of live and online entertainment. This Arts Festival represents an integral element of Kilkenny's attraction as a destination with an established national and international reputation for high quality events. Although the Kilkenny Arts Festival has committed to proceeding with a full schedule of events in 2021 its annual funding commitments from national funding bodies have been reduced. The staging of the Kilkenny Arts Festival in 2021 faces many challenges and cost increases due to the uncertainties and complexities of Covid 19 and the Festival has requested additional funding from Kilkenny County Council to help meet some of those challenges and increased costs.

It is recommended that an additional £7,000 in funding be allocated to the Kilkenny Arts Festival from the Tourism Festival Grant Scheme 2021. This provision to be made from the allocated amounts to other festivals not proceeding in 2021.
